Forest School



From January, every Friday afternoon, Forest School will take place for a class for half a term. I am really excited about this new initiative at St Margaret's School. We are employing an experienced Forest School Leader, John Burrell, and Mrs Fox is also training for her Level 3 qualification. We will be starting with Year 3 and for this school year it will just be Key Stage 2 that participates in Forest School, but this will change from September. I will keep you informed about these changes through the year. I'm sure you will be wondering what Forest school is! The Forest School Education website states that:

'A Forest School is an innovative educational approach to outdoor play and learning.'

The philosophy of Forest Schools is to encourage and inspire individuals of any age through positive outdoor experiences.

By participating in engaging, motivating and achievable tasks and activities in a woodland environment each participant has an opportunity to develop intrinsic motivation, sound emotional and social skills. These, through self-awareness can be developed to reach personal potential.

Forest Schools has demonstrated success with children of all ages who visit the same local woodlands on a regular basis and through play, who have the opportunity to learn about the natural environment, how to handle risks and most importantly to use their own initiative to solve problems and co-operate with others. Forest School programmes run throughout the year, for about 36 weeks, going to the woods in all weathers (except for high winds). Children use full sized tools, play, learn boundaries of behaviour; both physical and social, establish and grow in confidence, self-esteem and become self-motivated.

Children will need to bring their Forest School clothes every Friday when it is their sessions. All children will still attend Forest School even if they haven't brought their outdoor clothing, so you will need to be aware they may come home in dirty, wet, muddy school uniform in those circumstances. We do not have spare clothes for Forest School. All clothing should be named.

All children will need: Waterproof coat with a hood Wellingtons or walking boots Warm socks Old warm trousers e.g. tracksuit bottoms or jeans, not leggings as these can be quite thin Warm jumper or more than 1 if the weather is particularly cold Hat and gloves
